Introduction

The Maryland Network Against Domestic Violence (MNADV), the statewide coalition, convened the **Culturally-Specific Service Provider Round Table** in late 2014 to bring together culturally-specific and immigrant-serving organizations that work with survivors of domestic violence. These faith-based, legal services, and community-based organizations identified a need to share referral information.

This guide includes organizations that provide **counseling, housing, and legal services** that Round Table participants have *specifically identified* and *experienced first-hand* as helpful, relevant, and friendly to the culturally-specific survivors they serve. The goal of the directory is to include specific information, including information on provided services, language access capacity, and staff contacts.

The purpose of the guide is to be shared with *staff and volunteers* at the organizations associated with the Round Table, which consists of around 20 organizations. *It is NOT meant to be shared with the general public, on a public website, or with survivors directly.* Professionals working with survivors can use this resource to enhance their partnerships, expand their networks, and make warm hand-off referrals with survivors.

The listings in this guide are in alphabetical order by organization name. There is a key to indicate whether the organization is primarily culturally-specific (CS), domestic violence (DV), immigration (I), or sexual assault (SA). There is also an appendix in the back that shows which organizations provide counseling, housing, and certain types of legal services. Lastly, there is an appendix of all of the Comprehensive Domestic Violence Programs in Maryland, listed in alphabetical order by county.
